### Before You Begin

### Opening Discussion Questions

1. What first drew you into the story of Willowmere?
2. How would you describe the emotional tone of the book?
3. What did Willowmere represent to you personally?
4. Which scene stayed with you the most and why?
5. How did the pacing of the story affect your reading experience?

### Clara's Journey

Clara arrives at Willowmere uncertain and leaves changed.

1. How does Clara change throughout the story?
2. When did you first notice her beginning to belong?
3. What internal struggles does Clara face?
4. How did Clara's writing journey mirror her emotional journey?
5. Have you ever experienced a place changing you in a similar way?

### Rowan's Character

Rowan represents steadiness, patience, and quiet care.

1. How would you describe Rowan's personality?
2. What role does he play in Clara's growth?
3. How does Rowan's relationship with the garden shape his character?
4. What did Rowan's father's philosophy mean to you?
5. How did the slow development of the romance affect the story?

## **Elsbeth's Wisdom**

Elsbeth serves as both guide and guardian of Willowmere.

1. What did Elsbeth represent in the story?
2. What lessons did Clara learn from her?
3. Why do you think Elsbeth tested Clara?
4. What moment of Elsbeth's stood out to you most?
5. How did Elsbeth influence the ending?

## **The Garden as a Character**

Willowmere is more than a setting, it is part of the story.

1. Did the garden feel like a character to you? Why?
2. How did the seasons and herbs shape the story?
3. What role did the garden play in the relationships?
4. How did the garden influence Clara's decision?
5. What did Willowmere symbolize to you?

## **The Romance**

The relationship between Clara and Rowan grows slowly and quietly.

1. How did you feel about the pacing of their relationship?
2. What moments showed their connection deepening?
3. Why do you think the romance worked well in this story?
4. How did the garden influence their relationship?
5. What did their relationship represent beyond romance?

## **Themes of the Book**

The Last Herbal Book explores several gentle themes:

- Belonging
- Healing
- Quiet courage
- Slow living
- Second chances

Discussion Questions:

1. Which theme resonated most with you?
2. What does belonging mean in the context of the story?
3. How did the idea of slow healing appear throughout the book?
4. What did the ending say about choosing a new life?
5. What message did you take away from the book?

## **Favorite Quotes**

Invite each member to share:

- A favorite quote
- A meaningful moment
- A favorite character scene

Discussion Prompt:

Why did this moment stand out to you?

## **The Ending**

The final scenes show Clara returning and choosing Willowmere.

1. Did the ending feel satisfying? Why?
2. When did you suspect Clara would return?
3. What did the final journal symbolize?
4. How did the final planting scene affect you?
5. What did the final image of the garden continuing mean?

## **Reflection Questions**

These can be shared personally or discussed as a group:

- What part of Willowmere would you want to visit?
- What herb in the story resonated most with you?
- What does "home" mean after reading this book?
- What are you currently tending in your life?
- What quiet change are you experiencing?
