Before You Begin

The Garden Within

Willowmere is not just a place.

It is a rhythm.

A way of noticing.

Reflection Questions

- What felt most peaceful to you in the story?
- Was there a moment that felt especially familiar?
- What part of Willowmere would you most want to visit?
- Where do you currently find quiet in your life?
- If you had your own Willowmere, what would it look like?

The Herb of Quiet Courage, Thyme

Thyme grows low to the ground, steady and resilient.

It does not rush, but it endures.

Reflection Questions

- When have you needed quiet courage in your life?
- What helps you stay steady during uncertain seasons?
- Where in your life are you being invited to grow slowly?
- What feels small but important right now?

The Linden Tree

The linden tree in Willowmere becomes a place of conversation, reflection, and quiet understanding.

Reflection Questions

- Where do you go when you need to think?
- Who is someone you feel calm beside?
- What conversations have shaped you recently?
- What does “home” feel like to you?

The Writing Room

Clara rediscovered her voice in the writing room.

Reflection Questions

- When do you feel most like yourself?
- What part of your life are you currently rewriting?
- What story are you ready to begin telling?
- What has changed in you recently?

The Garden’s Work

The work at Willowmere is steady, shared, and quiet.

Reflection Questions

- What kind of work feels meaningful to you?
- What small tasks bring you peace?
- What do you enjoy doing slowly?
- What are you tending in your life right now?

Belonging

Clara discovers that belonging grows slowly.

Reflection Questions

- Where do you feel most at ease?
- What helps you feel rooted?
- What relationships feel steady and supportive?
- What would it look like to choose belonging?

The Season of Change

Throughout the story, the garden changes gently with time.

Reflection Questions

- What season are you currently in?
- What are you learning right now?
- What are you ready to let go of?
- What are you ready to begin?

Rowan's Quiet Philosophy

Rowan believes gardens teach patience.

Reflection Questions

- Where in your life are you being asked to wait?
- What have you learned from patience?
- What grows slowly in your life?
- What feels worth tending long-term?

Elsbeth's Wisdom

Elsbeth teaches that kindness and truth belong together.

Reflection Questions

- What truths have shaped your life?
- Where are you learning to be honest with yourself?
- What does gentle honesty look like for you?
- What wisdom have you gathered over time?

If Willowmere existed near you...

Reflection Questions

- What herbs would grow there?
- Who would gather there?
- What kind of conversations would happen?
- What would people come seeking?

A Quiet Reflection

Take a moment. Close your eyes.

Think about the final scene, the garden continuing, the journals resting beside one another, the quiet sense of something beginning.

Now consider:

- What are you continuing?
- What are you beginning?
- What are you ready to tend?
